**(OKLAHOMA CITY)** – Today, Sunbeam Family Services announced it received a \$4,500 grant from Walmart to bring holiday joy and toys to grandparents who are raising their grandchildren. This generous donation supports the 19<sup>th</sup> annual Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Holiday Program.

The Holiday Program is made possible by generous support from the Oklahoma City Police Department, the Oklahoma County Sheriff's Office, TRIAD and the Oklahoma Recyclers Association, who truly embrace the giving spirit by raising donations to provide holiday gifts to grandfamilies. Last holiday season, this program made the season brighter for 328 grandfamilies, including their 869 grandchildren.

Oklahoma ranks ninth in the nation for grandparents raising their grandchildren. Through the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (GRG) program, Sunbeam supports Oklahomans age 55 and older raising grandchildren without the presence of parents in the home who live in Oklahoma, Cleveland, Canadian and Logan counties. This program receives funding through Title III-E funds administered by the AreaWide Aging Agency.

Sunbeam empowers grandparents raising grandchildren through support groups, school supply assistance, holiday assistance and additional resources. Grandparents like LaDonna.

"This group helps me to feel that I am not alone in parenting a grandchild," said LaDonna. "I appreciate how friendly and welcoming the group members were. Having my granddaughter in the play area in the same building helped me to feel comfortable and able to focus on the group."
